




A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Science is an important part of our whole school specialist program and I joined with students and Mrs Blackwell outside my office when they were undertaking the daily weather check, unfortunately there was not much to report that day, no wind or clouds.

As well as all of this learning, our literacy programs which involves explicitly teaching all of our students reading, writing, spelling and handwriting is evidenced by much improvement across the school. Our maths program has a on explicit focus teaching mathematical processes as well opportunities to use this knowledge to solve problems and apply it to real life everyday experiences. We students to develop positive dispositions to learning in all areas and to be open to challenges.

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FROM OUR PASTORAL CARE WORKER

Have you heard of <u>Abraham Maslow</u> before?


Maslow was an American psychologist who came up with the "Theory of Human Motivation".

Sounds fancy, hey! But really, its quite simple!

His theory is, that, as humans, we can categorise the 'needs' we have from basic to advanced. And if we're not meeting the basic needs first, well, meeting our advanced needs is nearly impossible.

Now, as with any theory, things aren't necessarily 'concrete' so there could be instances where you achieve parts of some levels, and not some of another, and yet still achieve great things. BUT, think in big picture terms, and there's lots about the theory that rings true.

The picture below describes these levels and needs.



The first level, the foundation, are our Physiological needs; Air, Water, Food, Shelter, Sleep, Clothing. These are our greatest motivators because life itself depends on them. If we don't have these, its very hard to achieve the next level.

Can you see that **LOVE AND BELONGING**, can only be achieved if physiological needs and safety are met first?

Can you see that **SELF ESTEEM**, and respect for self and others can only be achieved when someone feels safe, loved and connected?

Can you see that **SELF ACTUALISATION**, achieving your own individual potential, can only be achieved when we feel safe, loved, connected and have respect for ourselves and others?

So what does this mean? It means that if we feel we are lacking in one area, or if we are concerned that our children might be struggling with things such as self esteem, respect or intrinsic motivation, maybe we need to look at the layer below and see if we are meeting these needs first.

Do we feel physically safe? Do we feel emotionally connected to our loved ones? Do I feel valued? Is my child's love cup being filled?

There are lots and lots of elements that make up who we are and how we see the world. *Maslows* hierarchy is a simplified picture of this, but it's a great way helping understand the basic building blocks of helping us to reach all the great and wonderful things that we were made to achieve!
