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FROM OUR PASTORAL CARE WORKER



Kimochis are a Social and Emotional Wellbeing tool that has been used at Bordertown Primary School for many years. On the surface, they're a family of cuddly critters and a big bowl of emotions, but underneath, they're a proven system for helping kids grow and transform by dealing skillfully with their feelings.

Over the next few newsletters, we are going to be introducing all the Kimochis characters and we would love for you to have conversations with your children about the characters, their characteristics and how your child relates to this character.

As well as characters, Kimochis includes a 'big bowl' of feelings and emotions. Below are some of those. When we teach children about feelings, we often use the saying 'name it to tame it'....meaning, that if a child can identify a feeling, by what their face or body might be doing, or what they might be experiencing on the inside, its easier to communicate the needs of those feelings and how they lead to our actions.

Below are just a few of the emotions and feelings Kimochis uses. You might like to put these on your kitchen table and chat about them with your child/ren over dinner time. Heres some conversation starters you might like to have with them:

Ask them to pull the facial expression for sad, scared and excited Ask them what their belly feels like if they are 'shy' compared to 'happy' Ask them what their arms and legs feel like doing when they are 'angry' Ask them when the last time was that they felt 'mad' and 'brave'

Understanding feelings is a great starting point in helping us to understand our actions. ALL feelings are important and there are no right or wrong feelings!



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
