Online Safety Susan McLean Workshops



On Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 2, Bordertown Primary hosted cyber safety expert Susan McLean, who ran both parent and student workshops. Susan was a Victorian Police Officer who has over 20 years experience dealing with the issues children are facing in the online world.

The e-safety Commissioner summarises the range of online issues that young people face as:

- Cyberbullying
- Online harrassment or stalking
- Image based abuse (when someone shares or threatens to share an intimate image or video (which can be altered through the use of AI) without the consent of the person)
- Exposure to pornography
- Risk of child grooming
- Exploitation or misuse of personally identifiable information

Susan shared some frightening statistics on the types and levels of abuse that children incur in the online world and her key messages in helping to reduce the risk in online use for children included:

- Children Under 13 are not allowed on Facebook, Instagram, Kik, Snapchat, iTunes and others
- Snapchat, Tiktok and Discord are the three most dangerous apps for children to use
- Roblox is dangerous for children due to its use by predators and children should not be using this game
- Children should not be exchanging any personal information online
- Devices should NOT be allowed in bedrooms or bathrooms, but only used in common areas
- Create a family 'online' contract so that children understand the terms of use of technology in your household
- Be aware the majority of children WILL NOT tell a parent/teacher if bullied or harassed online for fear that they will lose internet access
- Make sure that your children understand that they will not get in trouble if they tell you about a problem

These key messages were reiterated to children in years 3-6 in the student workshop that Susan conducted. She asked the children to reflect on their own internet and social media use and if they are using it responsibly. Students completed a worksheet they were able to bring home to share with parents and guardians what they learnt in the presentation. I would encourage you to openly chat to your child about this.

Susan's website, as well as the e-safety Commisioner website are both full of useful information on how to reduce the risk of children engaging in the online world. Having open, frequent conversations with your children about their internet use, what they see, what games they play, and who they chat to is a vital and integral part of ensuring our children are using respectful relationship skills in the online space, and helping to keep our children safe.

We would like to acknowledge and thank Glen and the D & M Rural Team as well as Helping Hands to help bring Susan to Bordertown. Your support in this is greatly appreciated.


