Staff and students created the infinity symbol, enjoyed rainbow jelly cups and a variety of sensory activities. The infinity symbol represents neurodiversity and the infinite ways of being. The continual loop represents the continual need for support, understanding and acceptance. This theme reminds us to look beyond the stereotypes and misconceptions and to ensure that people with autism are welcomed and valued in every community.

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Artist in Residence - James Parker

During Week 2, students in Years 1-6 had the opportunity to work with artist James Parker during a double art lesson.

The students were involved in a creative recycled art workshop experimenting with a wide variety of mediums; pen, pencils, charcoal, pastels, chalk, rubbings and textas.

They designed an animal made up from 3 different creatures (a Chimera) that they then built from cardboard using newly learnt joining techniques such as, spilt pins, buttons, sewing, zip ties, paper clips and wrapping techniques.

These cardboard creations were finished off this week during art lessons and will be displayed in the students classrooms in the coming weeks.













































South East Cross Country





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FROM OUR PASTORAL CARE WORKER

A couple of weeks ago, I was fortunate enough to give a talk at Kids Time Out to an amazingly wonderful bunch of kids. On this particular night, the kids were preparing something special for the Mums and Mum figures in their life before Mothers Day. So, the focus of our chat was on Love.

We played the game 'Would you rather' and the kids had to choose between two different choices that I gave them....like, 'Would you rather Ice-cream or Iceblocks?' or 'Would you rather the pool or the beach?' or 'Would you rather summer or winter?' Then we turned this game around a little with a focus on the 5 Love Languages. Instead of 'Would you Rather?', the question became 'I feel loved when someone who cares about me'.....and we used these following examples:

Gives me a hug OR plays a game with me
Tells me I am terrific OR buys me a gift
Takes me to the park OR helps me learn something new
Gives me a high five OR gives me chocolate

This is by no means an exhaustive list, but it was so interesting that, the majority of the time, these kids were choosing Quality Time and Affection over Words of Affirmation or Gifts. It was such a timely reminder to me, that as humans, we are wired for connection and we seek out human connection. Sometimes, that can look like what we judge as misbehaviour, but in fact, its our mind seeking to fill the void, the gap, that we so desperately long for.


The Love Languages aren't everything, and we certainly shouldn't think that if we have a tendency toward one, that we ignore the other, but they are a wonderful guide as to how as individuals, and as parents and kids, we can all feel genuine connection. Do you know your love language? Do you know your kids preferences? I encourage you to do some research....you might be surprised what you find!

Have you heard of the movie SEEN? Smiles All Round is proudly presenting this amazing film to our community free of charge! This documentary is highly recommended viewing by lots of professionals in the
